



Personality and Social Psychology Review (PSPR) Editorial Fellowship position

The Society for Personality and Social Psychology would like to share an opportunity designed to enhance global inclusiveness at SPSP journals. We are excited to announce the third year of our Personality and Social Psychology Review (PSPR) Editorial Fellowship position. This year the program is targeting scholars living and working in Central or South America. The Fellow will join an innovative, collaborative, and supportive editorial team for 12 months beginning January 1, 2025. The position includes an honorarium stipend of \$1,250 USD.

In alignment with SPSP's Guiding Principle to monitor and dismantle inequitable systems affecting historically underrepresented communities in personality and social psychology in our organizational efforts, SPSP's Editorial Fellowship Program seeks to create a supportive pathway to editorial leadership for psychologists from communities that have been historically excluded from these roles. The goal of the fellowship is to identify and support someone who: (1) is interested in editorial leadership, (2) wouldn't otherwise come into it at this moment in their career, and (3) may not have easy access to professional support systems that facilitate and support editorial experience and mentorship from centrally positioned scholars in the field.
